Brief History

The North Wokingham major development site is an urban extension of Wokingham town, on land adjoining the Kentwood and Matthewsgreen neighbourhoods and Keephatch Beech. As part of the new development, there are several new recreational open spaces for residents to enjoy the natural environment. These open spaces include parks and gardens, public open spaces, children's play areas, playing pitches, allotments and nature parks

Park & Ride

The Winnersh Triangle Park & Ride is currently closed. The ground floor of the car park is open to allow access to disabled spaces, electric vehicle chargers and for rail users to park closer to the station. Those wishing to travel into Reading can use the train or the nearby Lion 4/X4 bus to central Reading.

Thames Valley Park & Ride

Reading Buses run the 300 bus every 20 minutes Monday to Friday to Royal Berkshire Hospital (RBH). Please check the timetable here:

Rail travel is a faster, more relaxing and less stressful way to travel on business, and it's easy and hassle-free for leisure trips with your family and friends

Wokingham is the nearest station to Emmbrook Place. You can walk or cycle there in less than 30 minutes. The nearest bus stop to Emmbrook Place is the Dog and Duck stop, approximately 5 minutes walk to catch the 122/129 bus. The Lion 4/X4 bus service travels between Reading and Bracknell every 15 minutes and the nearest stop is the Rifle Volunteer, approximately 15 minutes walk.

Four trains an hour depart for Reading Station, two direct trains an hour to London Waterloo and two direct trains an hour to Guildford, Redhill and Gatwick Airport. Some additional services are provided at peak times.

The station is located on Station Approach, RG40 2AP. It has a cafe, 118 sheltered cycle storage spaces and 531 parking spaces.



Twyford Train Station is approximately 10 minutes by car or 20 minutes by bike. There are regular trains to London Paddington from Twyford with journey times varying from as quick as 21 minutes depending on when you travel. You can also catch the Elizabeth line train to London from Twyford Station at Twyford Station which will provide more flexibility for travel to London.

Electric Vehicles

Electric vehicles are better for the environment, cheaper to run and cheaper to maintain.

Pure electric vehicles have zero exhaust emissions, which means they do not emit any harmful exhaust emissions in the local environment.

Although the upfront cost of purchasing an electric vehicle is higher, savings are made in the longer term with lower running costs. Electric vehicles have lower servicing and maintenance costs due to having fewer mechanical components as well as being more cost effective to charge than petrol cars. Electric charging points are provided locally in the Carnival Pool and Shute End Car Parks in Wokingham. There are also electric charging points at Wokingham, Fleet and Farnborough train station car parks.

Smarter Driving

- Check your tyres are at the correct pressure to help the car run more efficiently
- Remove unnecessary weight from your car like heavy equipment, roof racks or items in your boot
- Make sure your car is serviced regularly to ensure it is running as efficiently as possible
- Avoid wasteful fuel consumption with engine idling or air conditioning
